4:07	Kendall Nagy, Director:	 -Cheryl is passing around 'Thank You' notes for MADC members to sign. These 'Thank you' notes will be given to all three local Walmart's and LePeep's; donors of breakfast food at the Recovery Day Breakfast. -The Recovery Day Breakfast was a huge success. Thank you to Cheryl for organizing this annual event and to the guest speakers Terry Austin and her daughter for sharing their family story of recovery. (See Channel 6 #findinghope news for Recovery Day Breakfast coverage.) -K9 Project Update- MADC, West Ada School District and The Education Foundation were working on
		a Memorandum of Understanding to move forward with the K9 project. The Meridian Police Department has decided to not train their new K9 for cannabis. After meetings with the project committee and West Ada School District, it has been decided to not move forward with the K9 Project. Kendall will continue to advocate for a drug detection dog within Meridian schools but as of now this project will not be moving forward.
	Teens & Substance Abuse Series DFI's Treasure Valley Youth Substance Prevention Forum	-MADC hosts the Teens and Substance Abuse Series biannually. This training was scheduled for March 2020. The target audience is any professional and/or parents working with youth; most attendees are councilors and teachers. This training offers continuing education credits. Drug Free Idaho has announced they will be hosting a similar training called <u>Treasure Valley Youth Substance</u> <u>Prevention Forum</u> (see attached flyer). With this information Kendall attended the West Ada Councilor kickoff meeting and discussed the similarities in training, along with the dates being so close together. After further discussion and recommendations from West Ada Councilors it was decided to not hold a Teens and Substance Abuse Series in March. We will focus our efforts on other prevention measures as to not duplicate efforts and help promote the forum to be held Oct. 29, Nov. 7, 12, 19.



	Grant Update	-We received a mini grant through Idaho State Division of Liquor last year and the prevention
		strategies we implemented cost less than expected. With the remaining funding we have been
		approved to see if Zach Telford will be the MADC Natural High Ambassador again next year. We will
		also use these funds to purchase some keychain breathalyzers that we can use at our Speedway
		breathalyzer event in partnerships with Meridian Speedway.
	SRO Drug Prevention Curricula	-In collaboration with Boise, Nampa and Ada County Sherriff's Office, the Meridian Police
		Department is working on streamlining drug prevention information that can be used within the
		schools. The goal is to build a toolkit that then can be given to more rural areas in the state. Kendall
		is providing information and knowledge for this project and will update us as it continues.
	MPD Education & Prevention Report	-Throughout the year (August- July) the School Resource Officers, Crime Prevention Unit and the
		Drug Prevention Unit / Meridian Anti-Drug Coalition collect data from each training / event they
		participate in out in the community. This report is called the Education and Prevention Annual
		Report (see attached). This report is shared with The Chief, Mayor, City Council, West Ada School
		District, and many other prevention stakeholders. Within the report there is information regarding
		how many events/trainings and number of people that were reached for each of the three areas of
		focus.
		• The School Resource Officers participated in 583 events/trainings reaching 14,484
		community members.
		 Crime Prevention participated in 84 events/trainings reaching 21,584 community members.
		 Drug Prevention/MADC participated in 72 trainings/events reaching a total population of
		21,564. Within those trainings / events MADC held 38 Community Presentations and 15
		MADC meetings. Regarding the 'Top Events/Trainings (based on attendee population)'
		Community Presentations was the top while the Breathalyzer event is second with 4,500. If
		we look at the 'All Ages' that also includes youth. The numbers for High School, Middle
		School and Elementary School students combined equaled 5,625 youth. To speak to the
		most recent event, MADC had 720 prevention conversations during the Community Block
		Party. All of this work couldn't be done without our MADC members and volunteers, thank
		you!
